

Suffixes (1)

- We add some letters to the end of a word. We call these letters 'suffixes'.
e.g. -s, -es, -ies
- Sometimes, we add '-s', '-es' and '-ies' to the end of a verb in simple present tense.
e.g. He/She/It sleeps early every night.

Verb + s	Verb + es	Verb - y + ies
eat → eats	go → goes	cry → cries
play → plays	mix → mixes	try → tries
work → works	miss → misses	fly → flies
swim → swims	watch → watches	study → studies
write → writes	wash → washes	tidy → tidies
