Fog

What does fog look like?

- Fog looks like a white cloud but **it** is not in the sky. It is near the ground.
- Fog can be thin or thick. It is difficult to see things around us in thick fog. In some places, the fog can be very thick. People nearly cannot see big buildings like London Bridge in the fog.



Where does fog come from?

Fog comes from water vapour in the air. Water vapour is water in the form of a gas. When the air cools, water vapour changes into small drops of water. Then, the small drops of water mix with dust in the air. Finally, the wind comes, and helps fog to form and stay in the air.

When do we usually see fog?

- When the weather is very wet, we can see fog easily. In Hong Kong, we can always see fog in spring.
- Fog usually forms at night because the air is cool. In the morning, fog may go away because the air is warmer. In cold places, fog may be there all day.
