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## CHAPTER CHECKLIST

- Asians has relatively straightforward rules that allow speakers to take a wide range of approaches.
  - In Asians, the Opposition cannot take a straight negation approach to the motion. The Opposition must demonstrate that the position they are defending has a net benefit or fewer harms than the Government proposal.
  - Each team's arguments should be set out by the end of the second speeches.
  - Reply speakers do not introduce new arguments or evidence. Instead, they give a biased adjudication that sums up why the adjudicators should give their team the win.
  - Because the Opposition reply speech follows the Opposition Whip's (OW) speech, the OW can set up the reply speech, highlighting the areas of clash in the debate.
  - The goal of the Government reply speaker is to establish or clarify in the mind of the adjudicator the standard by which she should decide the debate.
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
